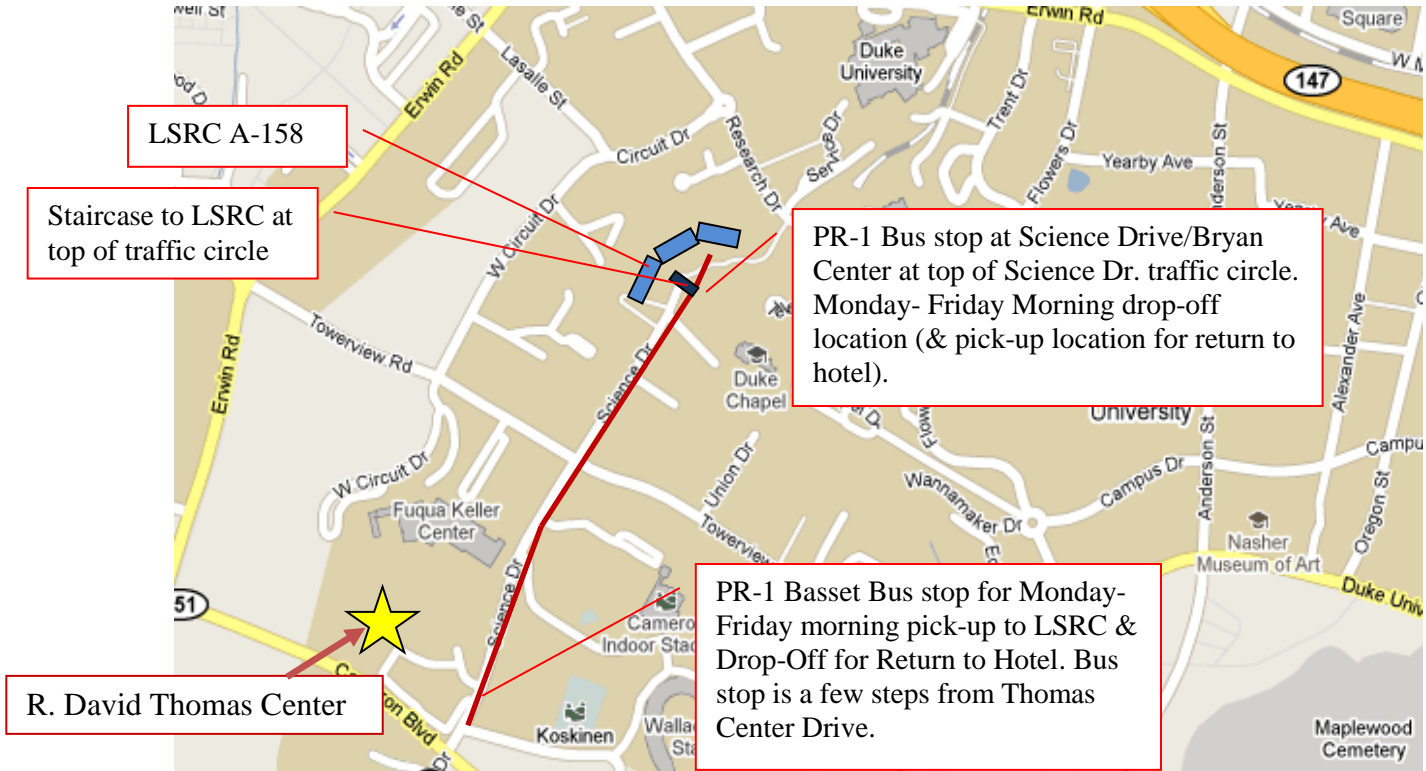

The Thomas Center is about a 10-minute walk from the LSRC. Duke offers free bus service, and the **PR-1 bus line** stops between the Thomas Center and LSRC **Monday-Fridays ONLY**: From Thomas Center Drive take a right on Science Dr. to the bus stop. Ask the driver to notify passengers of the stop for “Science Drive/Bryan Center/ LSRC.” The bus will go to the traffic circle at the top of Science Drive, approximately 6 minutes, which is the stop for the LSRC. Take the stairs located off of the traffic center and descend to the white building, which is the LSRC. See PR-1 Map and Schedule (above) for more detailed directions.

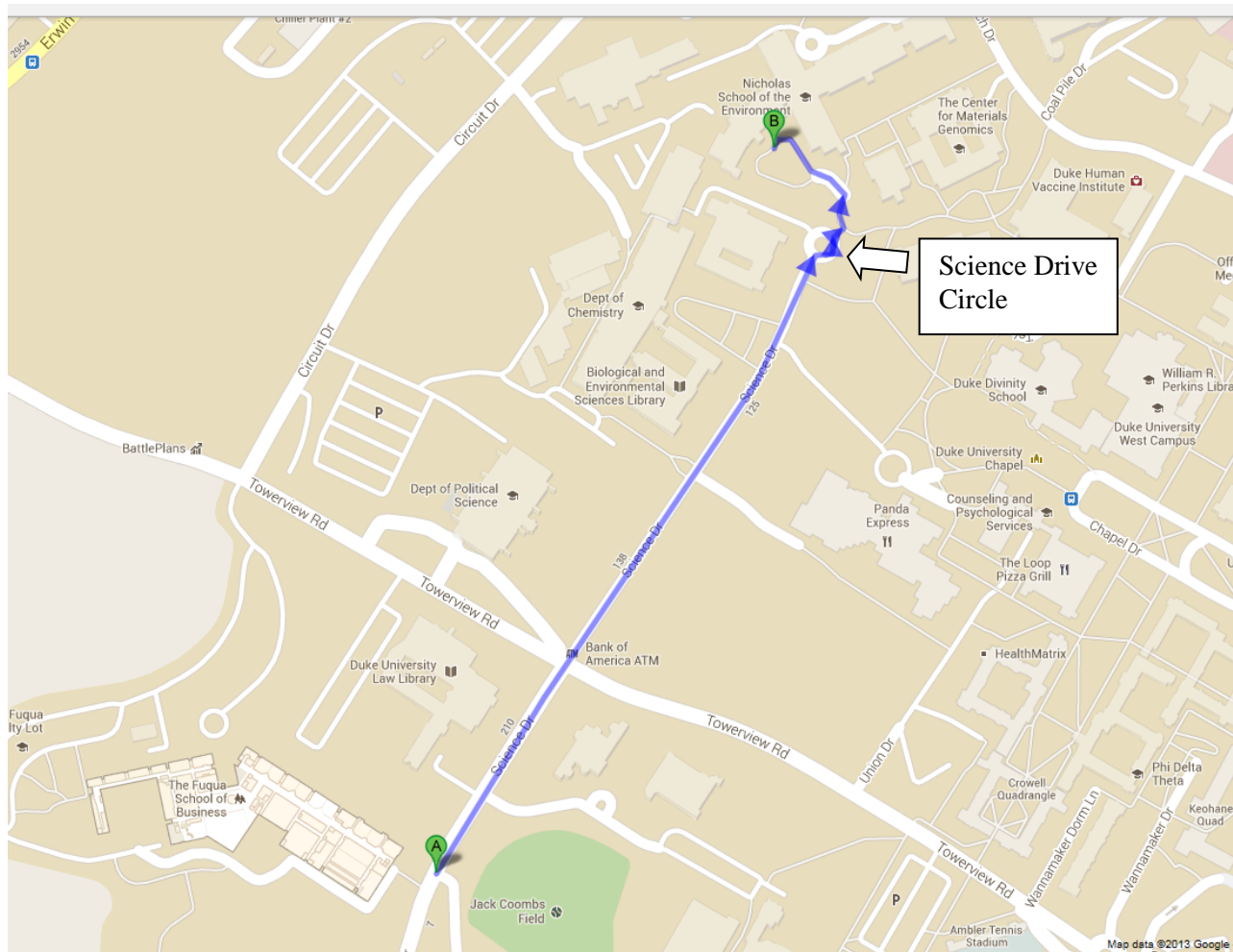

TAXIS

Because there are not very many taxis in Durham, you need to call by phone ahead of time for a taxi. Airport taxis/shuttles generally charge a set fare from Durham to the airport, ranging from \$25-\$45 one way (the below prices are estimates only and should be confirmed when making arrangements). Taxis below have been recommended by other Duke students/scholars.
