## TAXIS & OTHER TRANSPORTATION WHILE IN DURHAM

Because there are not very many taxis in Durham, you need to call by phone ahead of time for a taxi. Airport taxis/shuttles generally charge a set fare from Durham to the airport, ranging from \$25-\$45 one way (the below prices are estimates only and should be confirmed when making arrangements). Taxis below have been recommended by other Duke students/scholars.

**NOTE:** RDU = Raleigh/Durham International Airport

### Local Taxis Around Town and to the RDU Airport (Remember to call in advance)

- **Charlene's Safe Ride: 919-309-7233 (SAFE).** Flat fee of \$35 from Duke campus to RDU (for up to 2 passengers).
- **Durham's Best Cab: 919-680-3330/1-866-680-3330.** Flat fee of \$29 from Duke campus to RDU.
- **J.M.T. Taxi Service: 919.417-7033 (cell).** Flat fee of \$25 for students to RDU.

Bull City Connector (free bus that runs along Main St., where your hotel is located, including a drop off on campus to the corner of Research Dr. & Circuit Dr.). There is a stop right at the corner of Main St. and Ninth, and will take you downtown as well: [www.bullcityconnector.org](http://www.bullcityconnector.org).

Walking instructions from Research Dr. & Circuit Dr. to LSRC A158:

- Head down Circuit Dr. away from the traffic circle and towards the big stone arch
- Pass two smaller parking lots, and just before you arrive to the stone arch, you will see a walkway lead to a flight of stairs, take those stairs down. Environment Hall will be to your right as you descend.
- Walk straight, past the deck and courtyard, under the breezeway, and the second door on your right in the breezeway is the hallway right outside A158.
