

Course Numbering Inter-Institutional Courses

North Carolina State University

Graduate courses numbered at the 500 and 700 levels are letter graded (A+ through F), while 600 and 800 level courses are S/U graded. Courses regularly letter graded (A+ through F) may not be taken for S/U grading by graduate students. Courses numbered in the 900 series are open to College of Veterinary Medicine students.

Course Numbers:

- **100-299** Primarily for freshmen and Sophomores
- **300-499** Primarily for juniors and seniors
- **490-498** Seminar, project or special topics
- **499** Undergraduate research
- **500-600** Masters level and advanced undergraduates
- **700-899** Doctoral courses

The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill

For courses in the undergraduate and graduate academic careers starting in fall 2016, the numbers assigned to the courses are normally categorized as follows:

Course Numbers:

- **100-189** Introductory undergraduate courses
- **190-399** Courses for undergraduate students
- **400-699** Courses for advanced undergraduate and graduate students
- **700-899** Courses for graduate students (UG students may enroll with department permission)
- **900-999** Courses for graduate students only

North Carolina Central University

The course catalog number indicates the level for which the course is primarily intended. The numbering system below is intended as a guide.

Course Numbers:

- **0100-0999** Non-credit courses
- **1000-2999** Undergraduate lower level
- **3000-3999** Undergraduate upper level
- **4000-4999** Advanced undergraduate and graduate level
- **5000-6999** Graduate level exclusively
- **7000-9999** Professional (law) level exclusively
