

# 2024/2025 PROGRAM STATUS REPORT

## Community Outreach Fellowship Program



Through Duke's Community Outreach Fellowship Program, a new generation of leaders is bridging classrooms and coastlines—building stronger, more connected communities from Beaufort to Durham. The program's second year marked a milestone: its first cohort of Community Engagement Fellows (CEFs) completed their fellowships, while new fellows stepped forward to continue this growing legacy.



# Connecting Students, Teachers, and Communities Across North Carolina

Under the mentorship of Liz DeMattia, who now oversees fellows across both campuses, the program has created a thriving network of collaboration.

Teachers are collaborating on environmental curricula, and students who begin community engagement in Beaufort can now easily continue their work in Durham. This year, the program supported dozens of conservation and education partners and facilitated hundreds of volunteer hours.

# Supporting Programs and Partners in Durham and at the Duke Marine Lab

## Community Outreach with Carteret County Youth

- Ran **98** programs with **1,658** kids participating
- Facilitated Duke students **571** volunteer hours with youth
- Provided Duke students with **4,921** paid hours serving local youth (> **\$80,000**)
- Supported teachers with **151** hours of classroom assistance
- Delivered **4,990** contact hours of programming to kids

## Supported DUML service learning with connections to community partners (Duke Engage)

- Supported and maintained connections with local conservation and education organizations, including providing volunteers, running service-learning projects, helping with restorations, supporting workshops, and more. Some partners include: Streamkeepers, Town of Beaufort, and Carteret County Public Schools



# Supporting Programs and Partners in Durham and at the Duke Marine Lab

## Community Outreach with Durham County Youth

- Ran **106** programs serving **2,922** kids for **2,914** youth contact hours
- Provided **175** hours of teacher support through classroom visits (teacher support meetings and Duke students in DPS classes)
- Facilitated Duke students **493** hours of community engagement (trainings and direct student engagement with youth/teachers)



## Develop, refine, and support Ready, Set, Resilience

- Ready, Set, Resilience, a middle school program developed at the Nicholas School in close collaboration with NC State, local educators, and community partners, uses nature-based storytelling to support students facing personal and environmental hardships.
- Supported five Carteret County middle schools and 2 Durham Public middle schools in running RSR programs [**19** teachers], as well as three western NC school districts after hurricane Helene [**30** teachers and informal educators]

Students from Broad Creek Middle School in Newport, North Carolina, traveled to the Museum of Life and Science in Durham to perform a shadow puppet show inspired by fables about ecological and social resilience.

# Supporting Programs and Partners in Durham and at the Duke Marine Lab

## Supported workshops for community partners

- Helped run and organize four workshops that brought together ecological, personal, and community resilience practitioners with teachers to create programming across NC: **40** teachers in Western NC, **20** teachers in Durham, and **31** teachers in Carteret County
